The meeting was called to order by Council President Terry Pugh

CITIZENS HEARING:

Terry Pugh: Thank you for all coming tonight. Glad to see as many citizens as we have probably had in quite a long time here. I know there is an issue with the traffic light and I have talked to a number of people and asked that they would select a spokesman for whichever side you are for or against the traffic light and if you would speak for five minutes. I didn't see where it was going to be to anyone's advantage to have 10 people say the same thing over and over again. Vicki Falcone is the first on the list I have in front of me so the floor is yours Vicki.

Vicki Falcone: Council Members progress, growth and change, three topics that are in the minds of many citizens of Belmont County recently. Can you remember a St. Clairsville before the Mall? How about before Wal-Mart? For those of us who live on the outskirts we remember looking over the hills towards town and only seeing the lights of the Courthouse at night. When the Mall came to town many things needed to change to meet the demands of the increased traffic. Remember how traffic used to back up on I-70 during Christmas Season. In order to accommodate the growing pains things had to change. Luckily for the citizens of St. Clairsville and surrounding communities the leaders at the time had the foresight to realize that things had to change. They had to prepare the community and its infrastructure for growth. Growth in the present and the future. St. Clairsville is experiencing growing pains and as the Leaders of the City you have the chance to follow in the footsteps of your predecessors. You have a chance to allow for progress and growth at little or no cost to the City. Not too long ago this Council was approached by Gulfport about adding a traffic light at the intersection of Barton Road and Route 40. At the meeting in March you reported that due to gas prices they had backed out of the offer or at least table it. It is our understanding that this offer has been placed back on the table and you may be voting on it tonight. At that meeting we presented Council with concerns as Citizens of the City and the County have had with this intersection. These issues include those of neighboring Fire & EMS members, specifically the Barton Volunteer Fire Department. These members have returned Again tonight to reinforce their support for this traffic light for the safety of their citizens and yours. It was understood that Gulfport has completed a traffic study regarding this intersection. I was able to see the study interesting reading. The summary of the study stated that even before work begins on this pad the amount of traffic at the intersection

warrants a traffic light. The study also states that once construction begins on the well pad there will be an average increase of 30 trucks an hour. At the present time according to this report between the hours of 11 am and 6 pm over 900 cars approach Rote 40 from Barton. If you add thirty trucks an hour times the average 10 hours most gas & oil companies work that is an additional 300 vehicles trying to enter Route 40. The total amount of vehicles heading East on Route 40 at the same time added up to over 10,000 vehicles. I understand there are some Citizens who don't see a problem with this intersection. I will agree that right now there are time in the day when this is true but those times are slim. I feel this will quickly change once construction of the well pads begins. Traffic lights have the ability to be controlled. I am sure this one would have that ability which could enable the city to choose to keep it flashing during the slow times and change it to a working light when needed. This option will only be available if you vote yes on this traffic light. The bottom line is you are the present members of City Council of St. Clairsville and you have an opportunity to emulate the leaders who have gone before you and prepare your city for the future. Traffic is not going to decrease, it is only going to increase. This is a gift for the City. I was told the cost for a project like this could run about \$400,000 if the city were to pay for it on their own. It would be a shame if five years from now the future city leaders realize what a mistake was made by turning this down, where will the money come from then. Members of Council have elected two competent and intelligent individuals to oversee the safety of this city. Police Chief Jeff Henry do you feel this light is necessary? **Jeff Henry:** As I said in the last Council meeting, I asked Council to take a really hard look at that intersection. My feelings, it either needs a light or it needs a left hand turning lane, one or the other or both. I asked Council to really look into that. **Vicki Falcone:** Would you at least consider the opinion of your Chief of Police. I would like to close with a quote from Harry S. Truman. "In periods where there is no leadership society stands still. Progress occurs when courageous, skillful leaders seize the opportunity to change things for the better". I ask you, the citizens of Belmont County who travel this road every day asks you please be a courageous skillful leader. Please vote for this traffic light. Seize the opportunity to change things for the better. If you are not convinced that the light is needed at this time what about five years from now, how about ten years from now? What if your predecessors didn't have the foresight to do what they thought was best for the future of your city? Please accommodate the growing pains of your city. Make your city safer for those who travel it today and those who will be traveling it in the future. It is my understanding that the week after the March meeting we had here there was an accident at that intersection. Thank God it was not serious but what about the next one. Thank You.

Sheila Smith, Owner & Administrator for Alternative Home Health

Thank you for allowing us the opportunity to speak tonight. We reside in the Giffin Park Church property at 280 East Main Street. We employ about 100 employees Nurses, Physical Therapists, Occupational Therapists, Medical Social Workers and Aides. Those employees come and go by way of the driveway at 280 East Main Street. I could tell you that on a daily basis they see hundreds of patients all throughout the Ohio Valley, all over St. Clairsville, Bridgeport, and Barton and out into the Flushing area. It is very important that they be able to get out of that driveway in a timely manner. Most of what we do at Alternative Home Health has a lot to do with very critical patients. Patients that have IV therapy, medications, central lines. We are a hospital without walls these days. We do lots of things that typically used to be done in the hospital and it is very timely. If our nurses are not able to get out to see our patients timely

there will be issues regarding patient care. Our business originated in Bridgeport some of you may know that. It was also on Route 40 it was 867 National Road. At that time when I started it almost two decades ago in 94 when we bought that property they told us 24,000 cars a day passed that property. I never counted them, I didn't have the time. We had no traffic light and we were able to get in and out of our driveway. I do believe that a traffic light that will be a three way traffic light will paralyze my company and my employees and therefore the care that patients receive throughout the Ohio Valley. I am not really sure whether the city wants to put another road for my employees can get out of but that is the only way we can get in and out of our business. Additionally in regards to the survey that was done by Gulfport, there were some inaccurate facts in that report as well. It is not 45 miles per hour in front of East Lawn it is 25 miles per hour. They have our business not listed as a business but as a church. So I do think there needs to be great consideration on the people that will be affected. It is not just my business it is my employees, their livelihood and the fact that we have very high paying salaries that are contributing to the St. Clairsville taxes. We are a member of St. Clairsville as a business and I would like to keep it there but that will be dependent on you.

Terry Pugh: I have no one else that has called to address Council on this issue. All I will say is Council will take everything that was said here under advisement. We are going to go ahead with our Council Meeting and go through our different reports. The issue of the light may come up later in the meeting that is up to Council. As of right now I want to thank you both for presenting your sides.

Mayor Vincenzo: Council has approved Lindsay Piccolini as the new Recreation Director and I believe she would like to introduce herself. **Lindsay Piccolini:** I just wanted to say thank you and I am very excited to start. If anybody has any comments, questions or concerns I will be in on June 8th. We really want to work with the City and the Community. We want to hear what you want and what kind of programs you would like to see. So right now I don't know what will be changing but once I get in there on June 8th I will be glad to sit down with a couple of members. I thanked a lot of you guys personally. I talked to a few people who had some really great ideas so I am excited to continue with that and work with you. Thank You. **Mayor Vincenzo:** Mr. Bob Scatterday has been the director of the Ogden Race and prior to that the Elby's race. He has been very interested in the City of St. Clairsville on the advertisement of our summer programs. He has been really a great asset. He has included in this brochure all the programs throughout the Ohio Valley from Weirton to Wheeling to St. Clairsville. He wants to get together with our Recreation Director to work this out. **Bob Scatterday:** I was the rails-to-trails manager project engineer. I taught at Belmont Tech as an engineer professor for 30years. I am just a Warwood boy. It occurred to me last year when I was in attendance to some of your programs on Tuesday's outstanding. It occurred to me that nobody in Wheeling knew about you guys up here. You guys didn't know about the stuff going on in Tiltonsville. I became the unofficial executive producer of thirty thousand brochures free curtesy of Panhandle Cleaning & Restoration. I have two brochures, one is a temporary one and yours. Tomorrow night June 2nd you have Easy Street. I have to do a concert or I would be here myself, these need to be handed out. With the permission of Council, I have a lot here that I can pass out tonight. The idea is there six venues and you can plan your whole summer around a group. You can find out what is going on at Oglebay and they can find out what is going on up here. It was my attempt to have the right hand have the left hand know. Next year I am going to bring in Moundsville and

Wellsburg and we will do forty thousand. That is all free. That is getting people around the valley up here to see what your fine stuff is. That to me is good and you will learn what is down there too.

REPORTS

Service Director, Dennis Bigler

- Ordinance No. 2015-23 I wanted to call that to Council's attention. That does not have to be passed tonight but we are offering it up as emergency legislation so after it has the number of readings desired it can go into effect immediately instead of waiting thirty more days. Council is pretty much familiar with the condition of the RBC's at the Wastewater Treatment Plant. Construction costs in that project are expected to be \$2 million. It is a very expensive undertaking but this is replacing equipment that is approximately 35 years old and is worn out. Right now we are having trouble meeting our permit because of that. We talked about that at length in Utilities this evening.
- Last week the Mayor and I met with a representative of American Electric Power and we are able to extend the City's power contract an additional year at this time at a rate that at this time is projected to be at or slightly below the 2013 rate. I would recommend that City Council, this is energy only, this is not a bundle proposal so other things, transmission and things will float up and down during that period of time. This will allow us to extend the power for another year at a rate that is very favorable. I didn't have time to prepare any legislation for this evening but time is of the essence, as you know these contracts move daily. What I would like to do is we could have a confirming vote for this evening and if you need an actual resolution for next meeting. You might do some research on that Richard I think years ago we gave the Service Director or the Mayor the power because of the spot market nature of power contracts we will be able to take advantage of those contracts. **Richard Myser:** What we might do if the Council is in favor of proceeding in that fashion is to by motion tonight at least confirm that you are willing to proceed with that and give you authority to proceed and then I can get some legislation put together for two weeks from now. What we could do is put a time limit or

a deadline or effective date or something in the legislation to be passed at the next meeting. **Dennis Bigler:** What we are trying to do is take advantage of pricing this Friday. Prices came off a bit just today. Prices are up and down so we set a date when they could get their contract ready on their side and I believe it is Friday. I guess what I am suggesting is I would like for Council to give me permission this evening to execute the Power contract as of Friday providing it is in the vicinity of that 2013 rate. **Richard Myser:** It is not drafted and I don't have anything with me right now. We could pass that resolution authorizing to give you permission and then we can draft it later if Council is in favor of doing that. We could propose Resolution No. 2015-25 and we do have six members here so we could propose the Resolution suspend the three reading rules then pass the Resolution tonight and I will draft the Resolution as an emergency measure so it becomes effective immediately. **Terry Pugh:** Is it possible for you and Dennis to get your heads together before we vote on the Resolution and come up with a title of this Resolution to be read on an emergency basis? **Richard Myser:** It is pretty simple it would be a Resolution giving the Service Director authority to proceed with the continuation of the existing AEP power supply contract.

There was presented and read to Council on its first reading by title only, RESOLUTION NO. 2015-25; A RESOLUTION GIVING THE SERVICE DIRECTOR AUTHORITY TO PROCEED WITH THE CONTINUATION OF THE EXISTING AEP POWER SUPPLY CONTRACT AT A PRICE TO BE DETERMINED. Jake Olsavsky moved that the rules requiring ordinances and resolutions to be read on three separate readings be suspended and declaring an emergency; Perry Jones seconded the motion.

NEW BUSINESS:

Frank Sabatino: I would like to make a motion before Council this evening that the City of St. Clairsville, Ohio not accept Gulfport Energy Corporation's proposal for the red light installation at Barton Road and Route 40. Perry Jones seconded the motion. **Terry Pugh:** Is there discussion? **David Trouten:** I think it is too early to make that decision. I think we should we should probably look at it a little longer and maybe make some more studies before we make that decision. **Jim Weisgerber:** I feel sort of the same as Dave I would like to know and I didn't see it in here, although I might have missed it, exactly where they are putting the lights and how they are setting this up. I can see some issues but I also can see and I am not an engineer by any means but if they put them up right they can control the problem for Alternative by putting the light before your driveway and offset it that way and that way your people can go left and right and the people coming off of Barton can go left and right. Correct me if I am wrong but I didn't see that in there. I am in favor of the light if properly installed. **David Trouten:** I think there are a lot of opinions on either side and I think that we are not fully informed yet so I think there is no reason to rush on this. I know they want an answer by July but I don't think we should vote on this today I think we should consider it more and vote at the next meeting. **Frank Sabatino:** Mr. President I disagree, we have had Bob Whipp in here. That proposal was given to us in February and he was here in March. We have had March, April and May and this is June. Mr. Whipp wants an answer by July 1st. I think the time has come we have waited long enough. I think the folks with us tonight want an answer too. I refuse to withdraw my motion. **Terry Pugh:** If there is no further discussion then we will have a roll call.

Terry Pugh: This is my first time to cast a vote for a tie. My feeling on the this light is that both sides there is a lot of merit to it but listening to the Chief, Chief said if they are not going to put a turning lane in there is no point in putting a light in. I paid a lot of attention and I know there has been a few times where there were backups on that road and I thought about your statement about emergency vehicles well they all have lights on them and they probably are using them if there is a serious problem so that being the case I am going to vote against the light.

Frank Sabatino: Mr. President if I can, Mr. Myser correct me if I am wrong but I would like also to make a second motion that the City of St. Clairsville accept Gulfport Energy Corporations proposal to use traffic control signals flaggers at the intersection and area of Barton Road and Route 40. **Richard Myser:** Do we have a proposal for you said flaggers?

David Trouten: I don't think it is necessary to even do that. They would have to do that anyway. **Frank Sabatino:** Do we need that in the form of a motion? **Richard Myser:** I don't know that we would necessarily need that in the form of a motion right now we may want to talk to the Chief about that. You are talking about physical officers flagging traffic.

Frank Sabatino: That was the alternative yes. Mr. Whipp's alternative and I didn't know correct me if I am wrong I didn't know if we needed a motion or not. **Richard Myser:** I am not certain if we need a motion on that, I think we need to talk to our Chief on that a bit further. **Frank Sabatino:** Ok that is your legal opinion? **Richard Myser:** Yes. **Frank Sabatino:** Ok then I will go with that, I will withdraw that motion. **Bob Dorris:** Mr. President may I ask a question? **Terry Pugh:** Sure. **Bob Dorris:** Isn't the Council supposed to support what the people want? I was under the understanding that we came here to either be for it or against it. I don't think there would have been anybody here tonight other then what there ordinarily is if that were not the case. **Terry Pugh:** That is right and Council had a vote.
