**CITIZENS HEARING:**

**Mr. William Jeffers:** **Terry Pugh:** Mr. Jeffers you have five minutes for your presentation. **Mr. William Jeffers:** o.k. First of all I requested three times for the minutes from last time. They were not give to me. **Council Clerk:** I was advised by Counsel that you do not get them until they are approved by Council which will happen tonight. **Mr. William Jeffers:** What have you got to approve, my voice? **Council Clerk:** They are approving the minutes to make sure that they are correct. **Mr. William Jeffers:** It doesn't take three weeks. **Terry Pugh:** They have to be approved tonight. **Mr. William Jeffers:** From three weeks ago? **Terry Pugh:** Yes. ## REPORTS

### Service Director, Dennis Bigler

- We have a provisional hire for the Water Plant subject to our standard background checks and we should have that done hopefully this week. So we will have that position filled and the Water Plant will be back to normal.
- Later this week we are interviewing two additional linemen for the Electric Department.
- We are advertising far and wide for a licensed Water/Wastewater operator so we can find someone.
- Work is wrapping up on Route 40 as you can see. We will be done with that project hopefully this week.
- We are intending to catch Shelly & Sands before they leave and have them pave the base course of the basketball court that we are doing with help from Rotary.
- The work on the tunnel rock bolting is going on right now and that part of that job should be done this week as well. There is still work to be done inside the tunnel. **Terry Pugh:** I have had some people ask me when you think the tunnel will be open. **Dennis Bigler:** They have 45 days of total closure. It has probably been closed two weeks. They had a supply problem that made them shut down for five days. They couldn't get certain materials that they were after. That hurt their time schedule a bit but from when it was

actually closed they had 45 days. That is a pretty ridged mandate they have to meet. Besides us ODOT watches.

- On our surveillance with traffic stops netted one arrest that was made almost immediately after a theft. Also a license under suspension just with the surveillance of an officer that was doing just ordinary surveillance duty. It proves the fact that when these vehicles are in the neighborhoods and out on our streets doing the patrolling not necessarily sitting up speed traps but doing patrolling in the normal pursuit of their duty things will happen on the positive end and this. It has proven to be very worthwhile and I think the people in this Community appreciate the fact that 24 hours they are on patrol and on duty.

**Police Chief, Jeff Henry**

- I gave the Officers compliments also after that last incident. Like the Mayor said they just happened to be patrolling observed the vehicle over the speed limit, stopped it and recovered about \$2,500 worth of equipment from a Motel out on the East end. Definitely

it is good to be out there to be stopping people. Like the Mayor said you don't have to give them a citation for speed you can give them a warning but when they are driving under suspension and also have a truck load of stolen equipment it is a pretty good feeling. I got a compliment while I was on vacation. A man stopped me and said why are all the cruisers in my neighborhood? Is there something that I should know about? I said no there is nothing going on in your neighborhood other than we like to have the cruisers out on patrol. If you see something definitely call. We did have 12 cars ransacked. People leave cash, checkbooks, cellphones, and laptops. We ask people to lock their cars up or take the valuables inside and leave the car unlocked. Don't leave the valuables in the car out in front of their house. That is in the last week and a half. It has been all over town. **Jim Weisgerber:** I appreciate Jeff bringing this up because years ago we didn't know that and we weren't aware to be on the lookout and work with our neighbors. **Jeff Henry:** That is why I like to get it out in the papers if possible. Hopefully somebody in the neighborhood will be up in the morning see somebody running and we will get them rounded up.

#### **Finance Director, Cindi Henry**

- I gave you folk's examples of the reports that I have run off of another software of another job that I have. I wanted to discuss in executive session some contractual issues with that.
- I did talk to Lindsay today from the Rec. Center and we were able to get online and download the necessary forms it is going to take to be able to complete the Volleyball grant. That should be done by the end of the month so we will be getting that money back on that reimbursable grant probably within the next thirty days.

#### **Planning and Zoning Administrator, Tom Murphy**

- Just to dovetail a little on what Dennis mentioned, paving is coming to a close. Right now they are just finishing aprons at some of the various streets around town. I think they have completed the aprons at intersections with other streets along Route 40 now. My understanding is over the next day or two they will be working on Route 9. Hopefully by the end of this week any of the major work will be wrapped up. They usually have a punch list they talk to the city and go around and see if there are any issues they can resolve. That will be within the next 30 days it won't be next week for example.
- The second item the Board of Zoning Appeals will be holding a meeting on Wednesday, September 23<sup>rd</sup> at 5:30 p.m. One item is a conditional use from Perry & Associates who would like to move to 104 S. Sugar Street. The second item is a home occupation Joe Krehlik, he is the owner of Forever a Masterpiece it is a photography business. He would like to operate that photography business within his home at 105 Park Street that requires him appearing before the board.
- Another item there will be a Planning Commission Meeting. That will be Monday, October 5<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. Kelly Cappelletti the owner of Kelly's Suite II is proposing to move her business to 235 W. Main Street. It is roughly across from St. Mary's Elementary School. She would like to change the Zoning from (CD) Corridor District to (DD) Downtown District. A public hearing is required before the Planning Commission prior to recommendation being made to City Council. Any questions you have feel free to ask.

## COUNCIL COMMITTEES

**Finance, Libby Heintzelman - No Report**

**Utilities, Frank Sabatino**

- Dennis elaborated on a lot of the issues we discussed in the Utility meeting. Dennis we discussed the matter about those lines. Do we want to do anything on that tonight? **Dennis Bigler:** We could make everybody aware of it. We raised the issue of we have a number of continuing requests for fiber optic line placement on the City's pole line particularly along Route 40 and streets that parallel 40 like one block off or an alley way one block off running east and west. Federal Telecommunications Act gives pretty much unimpeded access for utilities to contact to pole lines and use City and other right of ways to build this communication network we all enjoy. Along the same token though when is enough get to be enough? When does the request become burdensome to the city, burdensome to the right of way, burdensome to public safety? That is what we were speculating about in Utility Committee. We currently have five companies that are contacted to our poles. They haven't all come at once they have been a few months apart, a few years apart. We are always out there changing poles out. It has to be done at the requesting company's expense. They pay a fee for the use of the right of way pursuant with the ordinance but I have been speculating, when is this going to stop? We have two requests right now. I know for sure that one is just going through the city there is no stopping off at the phone station down on Woodrow Avenue nothing like that. They just want to go through the city. I don't know what the extent of their engineering will be on the pole upgrades but we know there will be some. If this keeps going some day you are going to have 70 foot poles on Route 40. I think someday at the rate they are coming now. I don't know what the community wants. I think it is questionable if we should do that. So what I was talking to the Utility Committee about is maybe calling a moratorium or prohibiting any further contact to pole lines on Route 40. **David Trouten:** By Ordinance. **Dennis Bigler:** Yes by Ordinance. That is what I am talking about an Ordinance that would stop it. I don't know if we do it now in the face of these two current applications or if we wait and clear these and do what we have to do and live with putting two more up. Immediately at that point we say we have drawn the line in the sand utilities you go away. As soon as they ask we can say we have such and such that says you cannot go down this route. We hit our limit. We hit what is reasonable there we accommodated the industry we accommodated the competition but it shouldn't go further. **Jake Olsavsky:** Let them go underground. **Dennis Bigler:** That is another option. One of the two companies right now is talking about going underground. **Jake Olsavsky:** Does that tear your road up. **Dennis Bigler:** Well they could probably bore it but there would be a certain amount of tearing up and do you do it one at a time again. That is what causes the problems doing one at a time. The only City that I know of in Ohio that has really addressed this and it has been a number of years ago now was Dublin. They created what they call a doubling system which is their own underground grid they created for the fiber optic companies to go in and they mandated that they had to go in there into their underground ductwork system and they mandated they had to pay the fee that created that system. It is a good way of doing it. We have look into doing it. It would be a multimillion dollar project for the city to front. You wouldn't want to put in just the seven conduits for the companies you already have now you would want to put some in for the future. Somebody has got to

front that. There are risks involved there, if they don't come in or it suddenly stops then you are sitting on a bunch of unused ductwork. If you don't put it in and they keep coming and start coming faster than you are tearing up again. Then the other problem is where you put it. Route 40 East is really choked full of utilities. There just isn't much room out there. You talk about getting creative or going off the existing right of way out there. **Frank Sabatino:** Utility we support it and by no means is St. Clairsville against any progress. The thing is have we hit the saturation point. That is where we are at and how much can our poles take? We support what Dennis is saying as far as enacting an ordinance. I think it is just a matter of timing as to when we should do it. That is why we brought it before Council this evening. **Mayor Vincenzo:** May I ask Richard have you had any knowledge of this with cable companies Federal rights mandated? **Richard Myser:** Well I haven't but my input in the discussion we are having here if you have two companies coming in right now coming in and wanting to use it I think you may want to allow them to do it but what I would suggest if we are going to put a moratorium on I would suggest you put it in within six months period of time. That way plans that utilities may have they know what they are going to have to work around. That may generate some activity some inquires some participation from those other utilities in working with some type of grid system. Dennis can I ask you in Dublin when they put this in was this a prospective program in other words, they put it in and all the lines had to go into the grid. **Mayor Vincenzo:** Dublin has no lines nothing above everything is in conduit. **Richard Myser:** Would you be looking for the city to pay for this conduit system or would you looking for the utilities to pay. **Dennis Bigler:** I don't know this is pretty new. I think the City would have to put up some money. I don't think we could require the companies already here to go underground unless we went underground with our lines. I think we couldn't have the effect of blocking the telecommunication companies from going through town. But I think the test would be is it unreasonable from an engineering/safety prospective.

#### **Police, Perry Jones**

- I would just like again to thank the Police Department and Chief Henry about giving the advice to people about what to do in the City to protect their property

#### **Street North Side, David Trouten - No Report**

#### **Street South Side, Jim Weisgerber**

First of all I have had a couple of positive comments about the paving. People think it is looking good, it is nice but I also had a home owner call me about one of the garbage trucks that took out some power lines and ripped off the power from the side of the house. **Don Smithberger:** Yes it happened over on Dennis Lane. The truck unfortunately got too close to the edge. The line at that time was kind of marginal and he tore it off right there. We fixed it and raised the lines up. Nobody was hurt or anything. I believe the insurance company took care of the damages. Cattran Electric put it back on the house and we helped straighten it up. **Jim Weisgerber:** My question is we have done a lot of paving and we have X amount of garbage trucks that are rather huge and getting bigger. I am feeling that we need to do something to control the weight and the size of these units. I hate to be a dictatorship with the businesses but they have been in my mind one of the culprits that tear up the streets. It is just something as a Council I think we should think about the size of the trucks and what they are doing. That is all I have. **Terry Pugh:** That question is probably for Dennis. **Jim Weisgerber:** My question is the garbage trucks seem to

be getting bigger and hauling more weight. I think one of the culprits for tearing up the alleys and some of the streets is the trucks. Do we know how many companies are in town and should we do anything to maybe control the size of the vehicles. Streets aren't designed to handle some of that extra weight. **David Trouten:** By the same token we need garbage truck haulers. **Jim Weisgerber:** I agree maybe a bonding or something they could post if they damage things. Just something to think about. I have been kicking this around for about eight years and just never brought it up. **Dennis Bigler:** There are a number of companies 7 or 8 someone told me. **Mayor Vincenzo:** There were eight at one time I don't know how many more not. There are several companies, actually there is one company that has three axles in back. It used to be two but there is one company with three axles. **Jim Weisgerber:** That is carrying a lot of weight. **David Trouten:** Yes that is. **Mayor Vincenzo:** The alleys are taking a beating. I know Jeff probably can enlighten me a little bit on weight limits but unless you have a scale you don't have a proper way to weigh those trucks it would be hard to enforce a weight limit. It has to be a reasonable distance to take them to weigh them. It cannot be an unfair distance and we have no weight facilities to enforce a weight limit. **Jeff Henry:** The only time we would have access to that is when the State Highway Patrol sets up in the Mall area. **Mayor Vincenzo:** It is a problem. Jim has come in and talked to me about it but they are getting bigger. I can tell you the Alley behind Park Drive and Rand Avenue have had just about all they can handle. Maybe three or four trucks goes through that alley a week with different companies. There are some smaller companies out that have smaller trucks. They aren't hurting anything on that end. They can't carry enough weight to cause any damage. **David Trouten:** You can prohibit the three axles from going in the alleys. **Mayor Vincenzo:** Even the two axle trucks. **David Trouten:** We need to give this some thought before we do anything. **Jim Weisgerber:** That is why I brought it up, I have been thinking about it for a while. **Mayor Vincenzo:** I suggest that Mr. Myser might be able to enlighten us, do some research. **Richard Myser:** Well I think you hit the nail right on the head. You probably already have weight limits on your roads and on your alleys. The problem is going to be weighing them. If you cite somebody for overweight you are going to have to have some way to prove that they are overweight. Does the State have a portable scale? **Jeff Henry:** They have one that they set up at the Mall every now and then. They set a scale up and weigh the coal trucks. You can't just pull a truck over because you think it is overweight. There has to be some probable cause. **Richard Myser:** I wonder Sebulsky's have a scale and I wonder if we could contact Sebulsky's and see if we could use their scale. I don't know what you have to do to calibrate their scale. I wonder if they would let us use their scale if we suspect that someone is overweight and just spot check. **Frank Sabatino:** I don't know if it is feasible but could we request their record when they go to the landfill? Doesn't the landfill weigh them before they dump it? Could we request their records? **Jeff Henry:** I think there are some Villages that allow only single axle garbage trucks in their city on residential streets. You can't limit them on Route 9 & Route 40 but on the residential streets I believe there are other villages in Belmont County that limit the garbage trucks to a single axle truck. You are going to get people raising all kinds of cane because the price is going to go up if they have to bring a single axle truck in here. I can check and get back with Richard and Jim and let them know if the place that I am thinking limits to a single axle garbage truck on residential city streets.
